DISCOVERY PROGRAMME

Here are details of other commissioned and partner projects as part of Grandad's Island.

GRANDAD'S ISLAND SOUND SYMPHONY

Artist Helen Maurer – together with Year 2 pupils from Willow Brook and Riverley Primary Schools, musicians Ted Barnes and Dominique Golden – has created a Sound Symphony inspired by 'Grandad's Island'. Helen Maurer uses light, glass and sound to create site-specific installations.

This original composition has been created by assembling the recordings of sound experiments by the pupils including inventing Foley sound effects, capturing the sound of drawing, underwater sounds and perhaps some singing too! The musical sound work will be transmitted at the Langthorne Park finale on Sun 13 Oct, see details overleaf.

FANTASY FLOW

A mirage of dance styles capturing the essence of movement from all nations, taking you on a journey that you can only dream of. X7eaven Performing Arts Academy presents this original dance piece inspired by illustrations in the picture book with guest dancers from Downsell Primary School. Fantasy Flow fuses Contemporary, African, Bollywood and Streetdance styles - see it for yourself at Langthorne Park on Sun 13 October.

FOOTSTEPS FROM MY MOTHERLAND

Textile artist, Talula Noor and residents including Waltham Forest Asian seniors are using textile embellishment techniques from around the world to share intimate stories of their motherlands, of journeys to the UK and of sharing memories with children and grandchildren. Additionally participants have collaborated in translating the picture book to share in their mother tongue with their grandchildren.

RAW ACADEMY

This autumn RAW are using 'Grandad's Island' as a stimulus in their performing arts workshop. Young RAW-ians will be exploring all the different themes and ideas of the book through drama, movement and vocal coaching classes. The aim is to bring this beautiful story to life: using their imaginations and creative energies to lift the story off the page, and onto the 'stage' of our neighbourhood parks. Performances will be created in RAW's workshops by young people.



LAND AHOY!

Come together for a FREE FAMILY FUN DAY Sunday 13 October, 12 – 6pm Langthorne Park, Leytonstone E11 4JT

Multilingual storytelling, dance, procession, creative workshops and a community feast.

Step ashore on to Grandad's Island in Langthorne Park for an afternoon of activities for the whole family. Listen to the **Sound Symphony** created by pupils at **Willow Brook** and **Riverley Primary Schools** led by artist **Helen Maurer**. Settle down in the **Story Den** crafted by **Jane Frost** and **residents of Wood Street**. Step inside **Grandad's Shed** to find a micro-cinema screening films created among the island sets artist **Alexandra McKenzie** made with young people in **Leyton Manor Park**. Share in Grandad's fascination with creatures and their habitats, and meet **Suntrap** and some of their nonnative animals including hissing cockroaches!

Creative Workshops and Activities

Get creative throughout the afternoon with activities around the park. Join in the **Tree Treasure Hunt** with **Poppy Flint**, go **pond dipping** with **The Conservation Volunteers** or write letters to loved ones with **Scribble and Smudge**. Craft your own nautical hats or join **Louise Weir** who will lead **drawing workshops** to capture the day's festivities, flora and fauna of the park.

Performances

Author Benji Davies will be reading from his book 'Grandad's Island' and residents from Waltham Forest will be reading the book in some of the many languages from our neighbourhoods based on **The Babel Project** created by **The Mill**. Pupils from **Downsell Primary School** will treat us to a **dance performance**, **Fantasy Flow** choreographed with **X7eaven Performing Arts Academy**. We'll have our own choir of Grandads thanks to the **Three Valleys Male Voice Choir**. See the bird population of the park grow as artist **Del Taylor** leads us on a procession in the park made up of giant bird puppets created by **William Morris Ward residents**.

There'll be something for everyone on Grandad's Island in Langthorne Park and we look forward to seeing you there.
